Fr. Roger Writes Princess Diana RIP

It is twenty years since the tragic death of Princess Diana. Her death affected her family and the whole nation as well as. The vast majority of people experienced a personal bereavement. Mountains of flowers were left outside Buckingham Palace and Kensington Palace as tokens of love and loss. On the day of her funeral crowds lined the route of her funeral procession and throughout the country there was an unusual quiet as people stayed indoors and watched the funeral on television.

At the time of her death, the media coverage was unprecedented. My own thoughts were that it was good to respond to public interest. However, criticism of the queen and the royal family in the way they managed their grief was misguided. The media's criticism related to what journalists wanted the royal family to do rather than leaving them to find their own way of coping with their bereavement.

The twentieth anniversary of their mother's death has prompted a response from her two sons. Prince William and Prince Harry have spoken openly and frankly about the impact of the loss of their mother. By sharing how they have coped with grief gives others the reassurance that even royalty have the same reactions to death as we do.

Nowadays the death of a loved one or close friend still hits us hard.

Unlike previous generations a death in the family does not mean that we draw the curtains and cut ourselves off from the world as people can be a great comfort. Help can also be accessed from a variety of agencies that will help people work through their own bereavement. For many the help that is offered comes as a complete surprise because it is tailor made to suit the individual. It is designed to help the person cope with their loss rather than telling them what to do.

There are things that you and I can do to help and the following story illustrates this. It has its roots in the Christian faith but let us not forget that Christians are also seriously affected by death. The story takes the form of a letter written by a man to his aunt who was terminally ill and frightened of death.

"It is now thirty five years since I, as a little boy of six, was left quite alone in the world. You sent me word that you would give me a home and be a mother to me. I remember my tears and anxiety as I made my journey to your house. I remember you were waiting at the door, that you put your arms tight around me and held me. You had a fire burning in the grate and a hot supper waiting on the stove. After supper you took me to my new room. You heard me say my prayers. Then you sat with me until I fell asleep.

You probably realise why I am trying to recall this now. Very soon God is going to send for you and take you to a new home. I'm trying to tell you that you needn't be afraid of the summons, or of the strange journey or of the dark messenger of death. God can be trusted. God can be trusted to do as much for you as you did for me so many years ago. At the end of the road you'll find love and a welcome waiting. You'll be safe in God's love."

CHURCHYARD REGULATIONS

The Chancellor of Lichfield Diocese set down regulations for churchyards which we have to conform to. All stonemasons are aware of the regulations with regard to the stone memorials and should advise you accordingly. It is appreciated that it can be a difficult time when you are having to decide upon a memorial to have the added stress of considering what you can and cannot have, but we have to accept the regulations as they are.

It is not permitted to have kerbs, railings or chipping around the memorial stone. Artificial flowers are not encouraged but we do have artificial flowers within our churchyard. The strict ruling is they should be removed not more than one month after they have been placed upon the grave.

Balloons or other portable items should be removed one month after interment.

We are greatly indebted to a loyal group of volunteers who keep the churchyard grass mown during the summer months. It makes their task much easier if everyone adheres to the regulations concerning churchyards.
